Thank you to all the wonderful folks who joined us over the weekend of 14th & 15th of March to enjoy 'looking back and looking forward' sharing memories and contributing ideas for the future. Visitors enjoyed looking at photographs, maps, paintings, ancient artefacts and a selection of the Parish Records. One of the oldest items, a Short Cross Penny, unearthed in a garden in Ottringham, was minted during the reign of King John.

A selection of photographs and newspaper articles from an extensive archive, kindly lent by John Acklam, were the topic of great discussion and interest, especially for those of us who spotted parents, grandparents and great grandparents amongst the faces.

A collection of images of BBC Ottringham, whose transmitters were, in their heyday, the most powerful in the world, reminded us how important our village had been throughout this period of our national history. A display of 'Hidden Holderness' showing the changing landscape of our local area, its economy, culture and lifestyle, including its Churches, underlines the ancient and enduring nature of these settlements and the people who lived in them.

A collection of images of roof bosses and architectural features of the Church, provided by Iain Smith, enable us to date changes made to the fabric of the Church from Norman times to present day.

Displays from more recent times included a collection of items and images of Ottringham Women's Institute, 'Ottringham Events' from circa 1900 to present and some beautiful pictures of 'seed-time' and harvest, sunsets and 'snowscapes.'

We are immensely grateful to everyone visited the displays over what was a most enjoyable weekend event.
