VICKY TURRELL NEE CROFT FORMERLEY OF TOWN FARM OTTRINGHAM AUTHOR OF 'IT'S NOT A BOY!' AND 'ME AND MY MAM'

Vicky recently launched her second book 'Me and My Mam' at The Kingston Theatre Hotel, Hull. Many will remember the indomitable Madame Clapham, Hull's famous dressmaker who lived here opposite The New Theatre and her clientele who included Queen Maude of Norway the youngest daughter of King Edward VII and Alexandra of Denmark. Vicky's mother Lucy Croft (nee Marshall) worked for Madame Clapham and embroidered the sleeves of the above royal ladies garments. Lucy also embroidered the bodice of a dress for the Princess Royal, daughter of George V.

Vicky used to live at Winestead with her family. Vicky kept a diary as a young girl and her first book evolved from those diaries up to the age of 11 years.

Her second book 'Me And My Mam' follows the same style as her first as she sees things through an 11 year olds eyes and also puts herself in her mother's shoes and follows their move to Town Farm Ottringham until Vicky leaves school and goes to College.

Both books make interesting and often humorous reading, taking us through the post war years, the frugal fifties and into the 'swinging, liberated sixties'

Vicky was a science advisory teacher and head teacher before her retirement and has also written two books based on her fortnightly Nature Notes column for the Oswestry and Border Counties Advertiser.

'It's Not A Boy' and 'Me and My Mam' are published by Leaf by Leaf Press and are being stocked by independent bookshop JE Books, Hepworth Arcade, Hull and available from the website www.leafbyleafpress.com

Vicky states 'that whilst these stories have been inspired by real events, all names have been changed and some scenes and people have been invented for the purpose of the narrative. My mother's thoughts and words are from my own imagination.'
