OTTRINGHAM PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

Like most things this year the business of the Parish Council has been severely restricted, with only one alfresco meeting held since March. As such several projects have had to be carried over to next year.

Tree planting on the amenity field is going ahead, to replace those trees that have perished due to flooding during the winter and then the very dry spring.

It is hoped in the New Year to create a small garden at the junction of Old Road and the A1033 and to fence around the children's play area to keep dogs off.

Speeding on Station Road and Sunk Island Road continues to be of serious concern. We would like to hear from anyone with experience of this or any incidence of bad driving on these roads and also of any ideas of how to improve the situation.

Residents are reminded that the council provided dog poo bags are for emergency use and not to be taken in large quantities, as has been the case recently. Also once used it is asked that dog walkers remember to place the bags in bins and not to leave them around the edges of the amenity field.

The council wishes to thank Jason Risdol for all his help in tidying up the Church yard and Paul Mellor for his help on the amenity field.

At the end of October, when we counted up what we had saved, we were a little over a third of the way to reaching our total.

However over the next few days came the wonderful news that an anonymous donor had offered to pay for all the small Christmas Trees for the Village, and that Sunk Island Garden Centre, who supply the trees, had also offered to sponsor the two larger trees outside the Watts Arms. News of these wonderfully generous offers spread quickly through the community and very soon afterwards we received three substantial donations to make up the entire cost of the large star!

It is also worth mentioning that PC Chairman Chris Hoe, will be selecting and cutting and putting up the two large trees for inside the Church Gates and outside the Post Office – which are so fresh I sometimes worry that the squirrels will still be in the branches when we put them up!

MRS BEE'S EMPORIUM OFFERS LOCAL DELIVERY SERVICE FOR CHRISTMAS GIFTS

2020 has been a difficult year for most people, and especially for local businesses. With many people unwilling to face the crowds this Christmas, buying Christmas presents may present more of a challenge - especially for those who are shielding or who are not confident at online shopping.

Mrs Bee's Emporium - a gift business based in Keyingham - has a novel solution.

"We realised that many people, especially older people and the more vulnerable, may find it difficult to get out and buy Christmas gifts this year. We don't know if there will be more lockdowns, or if people will be willing to queue outside shops in the winter weather. We design and hand make gifts in Keyingham and we realised that we were able to offer a unique service" says Claire, who runs Mrs Bee's Emporium with her husband Dom.

Customers can buy gifts for their loved ones online - or they can email or phone Mrs Bee's Emporium and explain what they'd like. They then have 3 options, all of which are free of charge:

- Local 'no touch' delivery, on Wednesdays in November and December, by a mask wearing, social distancing member of the Mrs Bee team
- 2. Socially distanced kerbside collection from their Keyingham studio
- 3. Free shipping to a loved one anywhere in the UK. There is an option to purchase gift wrapping for a small fee of £5.

"We hope this will reassure anyone who prefers to minimise their contact with the world, such as the elderly or the most vulnerable, that they can still send presents to their loved ones at Christmas without exposing themselves to unnecessary risk" said Dom. "With our local service, our customers need not touch the gift themselves at all, if they prefer."

"Whilst most people are happy using online tools, some of our customers are less confident" says Claire. "We will happily take contactless payment over the phone if that is preferred. Alternatively, we take custom orders, so customers can describe what they'd like us to make and we'll make it especially for them."

Mrs Bee's Emporium's best selling ranges are mugs, plants in funny pots and photo socks. They are in the top 1% of all shops internationally on the craft platform Etsy, and have shipped items to 63 countries across the globe. All their gifts are designed and hand finished by Artisans in Keyingham and Ottringham.
