

OTTRINGHAM PLAYING FIELD UPDATE

The hedge beside the main road (A1033) has been inspected with a view to either laying or renewing it. The hawthorn has been neglected for some time and it has become straggly, so it has been decided that it should be coppiced; any gaps will be filled with new planting creating a substantial hedge within 3 years.

The Woodland Trust has confirmed that our application for a grant, to plant more trees and shrubs on the north side of the field, has been approved and the plants (420) will be delivered sometime between the 1 – 15 March. Planting will need to commence immediately and certainly by Saturday 16 March. The Playing Field Committee would like to encourage volunteers to help with the planting, particularly families with children who, hopefully, will see the benefit in future years as the trees mature. The planting will be laid out with paths and arbours where picnic tables etc. could be installed in south facing suntraps.

The total planting, over a 2 year period, will cover approximately 1/3 of the total area leaving a substantial area to hold car boot sales, fetes or sports.

Whilst preparations have been going ahead it has been noted that some owners are not cleaning up after their animals potentially causing a health risk for children using the playing field. This has probably resulted from dogs being allowed to run freely on the field. It should be noted that dogs should be under close control at all times on the playing fields.
